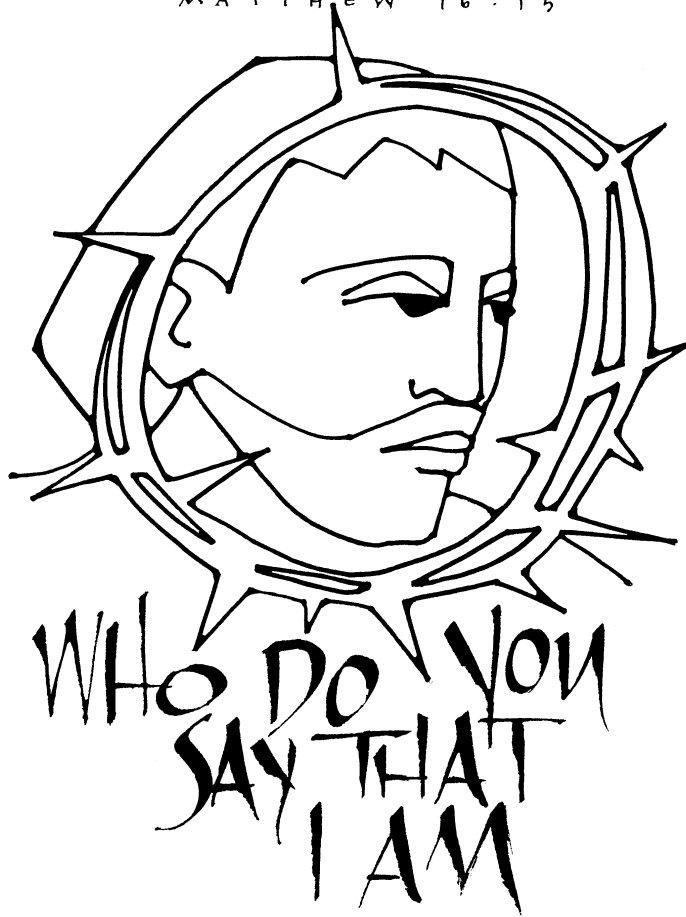

The Sacrament of Holy Communion at Grace

The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but His very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes. The bread and wine do not symbolize or represent the body and blood of Christ, but are the real presence, as he says of "This is my body. . . This is my blood."

Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are asked to first speak with Pastor Matthews.

The Lord Jesus Christ Is the Son of the Living God

Jesus asked His disciples: "*But who do you say that I am?*" (Matt. 16:15). The question is also put to us: Who do you say that He is? Flesh and blood do not reveal this to us, but by the ministry of the Gospel, the Father in heaven reveals His Son to us on earth, who has become flesh and suffered death for our salvation. Thus, we believe and confess that He is "*the Christ, the Son of the living God*" (Matt. 16:16). As He died for our transgressions and was raised for our justification, He looses us from all our sins and preserves our life within His Church, against which even "*the gates of hell shall not prevail*" (Matt. 16:18–19). His salvation is forever, and His righteousness "*will never be dismayed*" (Is. 51:6). He comforts us with the Gospel in His Church, so that "*joy and gladness will be found in her, thanksgiving and the voice of song*" (Is. 51:3). Therefore, "*according to the measure of faith that God has assigned*" (Rom. 12:3), we also offer ourselves "*as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God*" (Rom. 12:1) through Jesus Christ, our Lord.

Weekly Worship in-person and via Facebook Live!

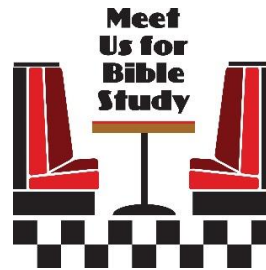

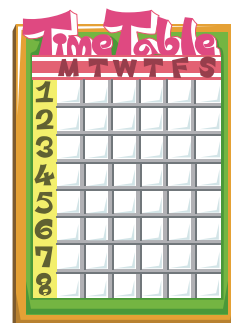
